DATA ACCESS AND IMPROVEMENT


- Require electric and gas utilities to collect, track, and report detailed data such as arrearages, late fees, and shutoffs
- Develop a "data dictionary" to facilitate data requests for uses addressing energy insecurity
- Establish data sharing programs and develop a standard practice manual to guide/govern how data will be shared, what information can be shared, and how it will be used
- Develop a process for community participation in identifying energy insecurity data needs
- Require utility data collection and disparity gap analysis.



The existing backdrop of discriminatory housing policies, racial hierarchy, and lack of procedural justice create a perfect storm of housing injustice, including energy insecurity.

Floridians have double to quadruple the energy burden than marginalized communities nationally.






CLIMATE CHANGE & FLORIDA

FLORIDA POWER AND LIGHT


- Rate Case
- Solar Amendment

In 2022, FPL hiked rates as much as 178%, even for those with rooftop solar.

In 2023, they will hike rates 3 times.

Ranked almost last in overall energy efficiency performance.

EQUITABLE WEATHERIZATION **CLINIC**

Lack of energy efficiency and sustainable housing led us to create the Equitable Weatherization Clinic to connect people to weatherization services.

- Disparities in access to weatherization services
- Administrative process is prohibitive and wieldy
- Miami has a large stock of Naturally Occurring Affordable Housing (NOAH)

DISPLACEMENT VULNERABILITY and Mitigation Tool

COMMUNITY DEMOGRAPHICS

The first part of the Tool aggregates specific data regarding the existing property upon which the new development is being proposed, the neighboring community, and anticipated property uses. The data will provide a snapshot of the existing communities composition.

VULNERABILITY ASSESSMENT

The second part of the Tool consists of an analysis of the data provided in Part I in order to determine the existing population's susceptibility to displacement. The analysis is based on a four-tier susceptibility spectrum: very susceptible, susceptible, moderately susceptible, and least susceptible.

MITIGATION EFFORTS

The final part of the Tool provides guidance on mitigation strategies that can be employed to address the potential displacement impact of the proposed development. The method and number of required mitigation efforts will be determined by the susceptibility level in Part 2 of the Tool.
