



RESIDENTIAL USE


COMMERCIAL & INDUSTRIAL USE










Energy Efficiency Workers by State, 2019




Energy Efficiency Job Losses: March 2020






Energy-Efficient Transportation Sales

2 million EV sales globally in 2018; 63% increase from 2017






Energy-Efficient Transportation Forecast




Average Energy Burden by County

Energy Insecurity before COVID-19






Job & Income Loss Forecast



JOB LOSSES

13% of adults reported that they lost a job or were furloughed in March or April

6.7 million unemployment claims in the Southeast



INCOME LOSS

39% of those making under \$40,000 a year reported being laid off or furloughed during this same period.




FINANCIAL SAFETY NET

53% of low-income households, **25%** of middleincome households, and **11%** of upper-income households report that they will have difficulty paying bills due to COVID.



Increased Residential Energy Use & Costs on Consumers




Home energy use could go up by an estimated 20-40%




